

Use the TimeMaps link below to access a European map from 1648.

- 1. Rembrandt was born in the DUTCH REPUBLIC. What is the Dutch Repulic now called? (**Hint:** Roll your mouse over *The Low Countries* icon on the map to find out the name of this "new nation.")
- 2. Click on *The Low Countries* icon and locate LEIDEN and AMSTERDAM on the map. Leiden is the city where Rembrandt was born; Amsterdam is the city where he created most of his paintings.
- 3. Return to the Europe 1648 map and click on the icon just above the HOLY ROMAN EMPIRE. Read the paragraphs below the map to learn more about this empire's history, then find a modern map of the area and compare how the area has changed.


